Victoria Early Pregnancy Assessment Unit

We are located in the office of Dr John Cooper, M.D., F.R.C.S.C., Obstetrician and Gynecologist.

Did

Approximately 50% of all pregnant women experience some bleeding during the first weeks of pregnancy. While first trimester bleeding is common, and does not necessarily indicate a pregnancy loss, it can be extremely distressing for the pregnant woman. It is necessary to investigate episodes of first trimester bleeding, not only to confirm the viability of a pregnancy but also to look for other pregnancy complications which may pose a risk to mother or baby.

What

The purpose of the Early Pregnancy Assessment Unit is to provide timely and sensitive urgent assessment for the woman experiencing worrisome first trimester pregnancy complications. Care can be accessed by referral at any time up to and including fourteen weeks gestation.

Our Nurse Clinician is available Monday through Friday to provide urgent assessment of first trimester bleeding or cramping. This will include an office consultation and ultrasound assessment to determine the viability of the pregnancy. If necessary, she can also provide ongoing assessment over a period of weeks to monitor the status of a worrisome pregnancy. She can provide ongoing support and facilitate access to other services as needed.

Dr Cooper is the Clinic Director and is available on an urgent basis to provide obstetrical specialist assessment and treatment as required.

Our goal is to help the woman who is facing a possible pregnancy complication or loss obtain an answer as quickly as possible without the trauma of repeated and possibly lengthy hospital emergency room visits. As well, we will provide supportive medical and emotional care in any way that she needs, in as timely a manner as possible. We know that this can be traumatic, and we want to make the assessment, diagnosis and treatment process as smooth as possible.

How to

If you are experiencing first trimester bleeding or cramping, you must first notify your primary care physician, maternity doctor, or midwife. They can contact us by phone, and submit a referral. In most cases, you will be able to be seen very quickly.
